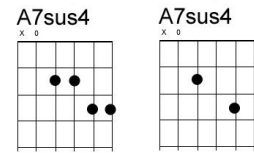


I Dig Rock and Roll Music

 I figure it's about the happiest sound going down today.

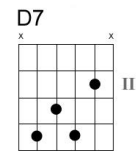
Bm G Bm G

 And they got a good thing going when the words don't get in the way.

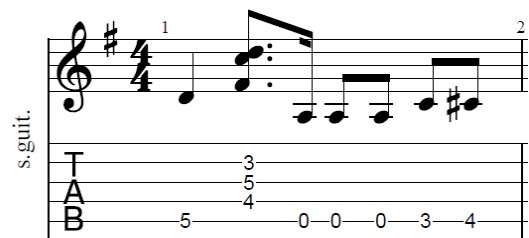
Bm G Bm G
